Indirect speech

Put the following sentences into indirect speech. Some changes need to be made (tenses, pronouns, word order) as shown in the example.

EXAMPLE : "Is this your first time?" I asked.

→ I asked if **that was their** first time.

> I asked where they were headed.

b. "We're going to stay at an ashram", his friend announced.

> His friend announced they were going to stay at an ashram.

c. "I don't know", I replied.

> I replied that I didn't know.

d. "We're staying overnight and catching a train tomorrow", he explained.

> He explained that they were staying overnight and catching a train tomorrow.

e. "We can share a room", he suggested.

> He suggested that they (could) share a room.

f. "And it's a lot safer", he added.

> He added that it was a lot safer.

g. "Get out of the cities as fast as you can", the shorter man advised me.

> The shorter man advised me to get out of the cities as fast as I could.
